

#### Neighbours Day Aotearoa (NDA) Key Messages

- 1. The aim of NDA is to get as many people as possible to connect with their neighbours over the course of the NDA weekend
  - "Go one step further in getting to know your neighbours"
  - It's not about big events, but encouraging local activity in every street and neighbourhood
  - It's never too late to say hello over the fence we can all start somewhere
  - Turning strangers into neighbours
  - Turning streets into neighbourhoods

### 2. Great neighbourhoods start with great neighbours

- You can make a difference in your neighbourhood change can happen in our own backyards
- Everyone in the neighbourhood has something to offer find out what your neighbours enjoy and are good at
- Neighbourliness is a decision / a choice
- Encouraging ordinary people to do extraordinary things for the benefit of others and to put heart back in community living
- Know your neighbours: Be the change where you live

#### 3. Social connection in neighbourhoods is good for our wellbeing

- Stronger neighbourhoods can be part of the successful antidote for the many 'social issues' within Aotearoa.
- Being good neighbours makes a difference
- Through fostering better connected neighbourhoods and more everyday 'neighbourliness',
   Kiwi communities can be stronger and more resilient and the wellbeing of individuals,
   family/whanau and community will be significantly enhanced
- The neighbourhood is a powerful platform for meeting people who are different to us and helping us learn how to connect with a variety of people. Showing respect honours our combined heritage
- NDA has a vision to see strong, connected (safe, fun, respectful, friendly) neighbourhoods in every street in New Zealand and to help re-invigorate a culture of neighbourliness and manaakitanga in local communities where this is currently not the norm

### 4. NDA is a catalyst for a movement

- Everyday can be a neighbours day
- The long term vision of NDA is to see every street in NZ participating in NDA, and ultimately to see fun, safe, respectful, friendly neighbourhoods throughout Aotearoa NZ

## 5. New Zealand is a neighbourly nation

- Being a good neighbour is part of the Kiwi DNA
- NDA aims to drive shifts in attitude and behaviour of Kiwis as neighbours and towards our neighbours
- NDA aims to inspire every Kiwi introduce themselves to their nearest neighbour, resulting in lifelong friendships and strong community belief

# 6. 'Atawhaingia te Pa harakeke'

- This whakatauki / proverb (gifted by Tamati Patuwai) speaks to the essence of what NDA is attempting to do, which is to nurture the familial bonds, the solidarity and unity of community.
  - o Atawhaingia: Nurture, protect, cultivate, love
  - Pa Harakeke: The Pa Harakeke is the Harakeke (flax) grove of the village. In this
    instance the Pa Harakeke is used as a metaphor for the intertwined community
